As we see nearly a month of 2021 in our rearview mirror I hope you're able to let words of promise and hope echo through each day. One of my favorite passages that you may have often heard from me comes from the Lord's words of hope to His people who faced very difficult struggles. Here's Lamentations 3:19-23 – "I remember my affliction and my wandering, the bitterness and the gall. I well remember them, and my soul is

downcast within me."

(Okay, that's not my favorite part yet, but here we go now:)
"Yet this I call to mind and therefore I have hope: Because of the Lord's great love we are not consumed, for His compassions never fail. They are new every morning; great is Your faithfulness."

A challenge that I see standing out that seems to carry over from these past ten months or so, is the challenge of separation and isolation that I believe has been strong for so many people. I hear it in the words and see it in the tears of God's faithful people. We feel cut off from family, friends, church members. We feel afraid, nervous, angry, hurt, disappointed. To these physical and emotional factors add an alarming degree of division we sense in our nation over values, allegiances, ideals, and goals.

This threat to unity is felt in the Body of Christ. Just before He was arrested, Jesus prayed for the Church that He knew would face struggles of division and strife (John 17:20-21): "My prayer is not for them (His close disciples) alone. I pray also for those who will believe in Me through their message, that all of them may be one, Father, just as You are in Me and I am in You. May they also be in Us so that the world may believe that You have sent Me." Jesus prays for our unity in Him!

For that reason, our staff believes it is timely, in this year *Twenty Twenty-ONE*, that we emphasize the oneness that God brings to us in our Savior Jesus. Even though we are still challenged by separation and isolation in many forms, we hold as true God's

declaration in Jesus that we are one with Him, and therefore with one another. Listen to this calling to the Church in Ephesians 4:2-6: Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace. There is one body and one

Spirit, just as you were called to one hope when you were called; one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all.

Do you catch what this says? Where circumstances of distance and separation can seem to threaten life together, we are brought together by the powerful and compassionate call of ONE Lord into ONE body in Jesus Christ. We are gathered by One Hope into One Family having One Purpose! Throughout 2020ne, we'll explore ways in which God's gifts and blessings hold us together as His people and move us forward as one through every challenge and opportunity ahead!

LWML Grant #19—\$100,000 for the 2019-2021 biennium is "Making Jesus Known in the United States Ethnic Communities at Concordia Seminary, St. Louis." The seminary offers distance learning and training so that men can be ordained to serve churches in multiethnic communities. This grant gives financial assistance for the training.

Across the country, in both rural and urban areas, there are passionately devoted first-generation immigrants serving in full-time ministry positions who share the Gospel among their immigrant/ ethnic communities. A number of these dedicated church workers are students enrolled in two Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, programs: the Center for Hispanic Studies (CHS) and the Ethnic Immigrant Institute of Theology (EIIT). The "Making Jesus Known in the United States Ethnic Communities at Concordia Seminary, St. Louis" mission grant will give financial assistance to meet their tuition needs. WHAT IS THE SIGNIFICANCE OF LENT?

Early in the Church's history, the major events in Christ's life were observed with special observances, such as His birth, baptism, death, resurrection and ascension. As these observances developed, a period of time was set aside prior to the major events of Jesus' birth and resurrection as a time of preparation.

During Lent, the Church's worship assumes a more penitential character. The color for the season is purple, a color often associated with penitence. The "Hymn of Praise" is omitted from the liturgy. The word "Alleluia" is usually omitted as well. By not using the alleluia, a joyful expression meaning "Praise the Lord"--until Easter, the Lenten season is clearly set apart as a distinct time from the rest of the year. Additionally, it

forms a powerful contrast with the festive celebration of Jesus' resurrection when our alleluias ring loud and clear.

Finally, the penitential character of Lent is not its sole purpose. In the ancient Church, the weeks leading up to Easter were a time of intensive preparation of the candidates who were to be baptized at the Easter vigil on Holy Saturday. This time in the Church's calendar was seen as an especially appropriate time for Baptism because of the relationship between Christ's death and resurrection and our own in Holy Baptism (see Romans 6:1-11). This focus would suggest that the season of Lent serves not only as a time to meditate on the suffering that Christ endured on our behalf but also as an opportunity to reflect upon our own Baptism and what it means to live as a child of God.

- -Why did Jesus do this? Because Jesus is love.

Faith

As Christians we are often asked to define our faith or to describe what faith is. So how would you explain what "faith" is? Below are some ideas to help.

The dictionary says "faith" is . . .

confidence or trust in a person or thing; belief that is not based on proof; belief in God or in the doctrines or teachings of <u>reliaion</u>;

Martin Luther described "faith" as. . .

- "... a living and unshakable confidence, a belief in the grace of God so assured that a man would die a thousand deaths for its sake"
- "... permitting ourselves to be seized by the things we do not see."

In "What Luther Says" compiled by Ewald M. Plass and published by CPH in 1959, Plass writes:

"Faith Is. . . the Evidence of Things Not Seen."
"Faith is the "Yes" of the Heart."

"Faith" is one of those concepts that is very hard to define. God's Word gives us the perfect definition to share with those who ask us to explain it: "Now faith is being sure of what we hope for and certain of what we do not see." - Hebrews 11:1. (Read Hebrews 11 for examples of faith in action.)
