However, with increasing enrollment at all levels, it's time to expand again. We are therefore thrilled to announce the public phase of *Our Highest Gifts for Our High School*—a capital campaign to build high school space at Sioux Falls Lutheran School. It is our

prayerful goal to start construction on the high school addition in April, 2021, completing at least Phase I of the high school wing for \$750K by August, 2021.
