

# Personal Connections

Hey, Memorial family! Everything back to normal for you yet?

I didn't think so.

When we started shutting things down on our Memorial campus and limiting contact back in the middle of March, I naively thought to myself, "Wow! I suppose this might last a few weeks, but I'm kind of thinking that we'll be able to be back to normal bu Easter." And then came Memorial Day weekend, and only then did we begin to gather at church for brief 20-minute worship opportunities with the Lord's Supper. Phase II of regathering happened in the middle of June when we opened up an 8 AM and 11 AM worship service. In September we moved to Phase III by regathering for Sunday School and for an additional service at 9:30 – but not without restrictions.

I guess we could say we're moving forward. I hesitate to say "toward normal," because I'm not really 100% sure what that's supposed to be. We're certainly not gathering as freely as we used to gather. For some it's a challenge to gather at all. Frankly, it's also become much more difficult to accomplish a visitation ministry. Visits on people who are ill are quite restrictive. If one receives care from some type of health institution, access is quite limited. Even making a visit to someone's home – which in the last couple decades was becoming more uncommon – is now even less likely to take place.

Do you know what I miss the most? I miss so many of those personal connections with all of you that I'm realizing have been affirmed in the past by even some quick eye contact and a smile. It's not happening as easily or as often!

But I'd like to connect with you! Can we help each other out? I've been trying to initiate more phone contact during these months and have reached a number of you. I know others have as well. But I want to extend this personal encouragement ... give me a call to let me know how you're doing and to see how I'm doing - especially if we haven't talked for a while. I've heard that some of you suppose that I'm too busy, but I'd love to take your call or give you a return call if I'm occupied for the moment. Or perhaps make sure you connect with another of our ministry staff, or maybe a friend from church. Some of you connect through social media – keep those connections

going! If you call my cell phone (if you don't have my number, you can get it by calling the church office), please leave a message if I don't answer. I often don't immediately respond to an unfamiliar number and I lost a lot of my contact list when my cell phone and I combined on a little swimming adventure this summer.

The connections we make in the Body of Christ are critical. I need them. I believe you need them. Ultimately they encourage one another back toward the Lifegiving connection that is ours in Jesus, the living Word of God!


