"Dwelling in God-Today"

In our house we have a daily routine. And while that routine ebbs and flows, for the most part, it stays the same. There is comfort in the routine. And with four children, a teacher, and a pastor living in the house, our routine is divided into two sections; we have a summer routine and a school year routine. And as our summer routine is winding down and we are gearing up for the school year, I find myself, well... paralyzed with fear... Fear of COVID, fear of the political unrest in our society, fear that I don't know what is going to happen today, so how can I ever plan for what is going to happen tomorrow. Fear that our routine will never be the same. Basically, fear of the unknown.

Now this is not a "new" feeling. In the Bible, the message, "Do not fear" occurs some 365 times, in one phrasing or another. Fear is as much a part of our lives as hope. And as Christ followers gifted with faith, in fear, we turn to hope. *"Now faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see... By faith we understand that the universe was formed at God's command,*

so that what is seen was not made out of what was visible." (Hebrews 11:1-3 NIV)

And then this year passed and poof, magically, there was no more sense of confidence, but instead a sense of fear.

Then I saw this quote on Facebook and I wished that I'd come up with it.

"False Evidence Appearing Real." We all know that being afraid of the future is just as silly as being afraid of our own shadows, and yet we fear it all the same. Why?

The answer is within the quote; it's a false sense of reality. We imagine what we don't want to lose and instantly grow afraid of that loss. But we're being bamboozled; we're duping ourselves out of a secure sense of "now" and replacing it with an insecure sense of "what if." What if COVID spikes? What if the economy collapses? What if my routine never gets back to normal? And these "what ifs" rob us of living a life secure in Christ. When we look to far ahead we live in the agony of not knowing what will come next, instead of living in today.

And I wonder if the better message is to look at where we are now, including those things around us that have changed and that "keep us up at night." To name the worries and the

concerns, and to remember that we know how it will end. *"Lord, you have been our dwelling place... Before the mountains were born or you brought forth the whole world, from everlasting to everlasting you are God."* (Ps 90:1-2 NIV)

The good news is that beyond all the good and bad of what happens today, there is a steadying certainty: Before the mountains were formed, and even before the earth came into existence...even before there was a tomorrow to think about, God has "been and will be our dwelling place." What happened yesterday and what happens tomorrow do not affect the Lord of heaven and earth.

For that very reason Jesus Christ, the Son of God, reminds us not to worry about tomorrow. As it is for the birds of the air and the lilies of the field for which God provides every day, let us rest in the assurance that every new day is God's gift to us. (cf: Matthew 6:25-34)

There is comfort in our routines. Maybe our routines are new. Maybe our new routines place us focused on being present for each moment today...rather than looking to fulfill an optimistic guess about tomorrow.

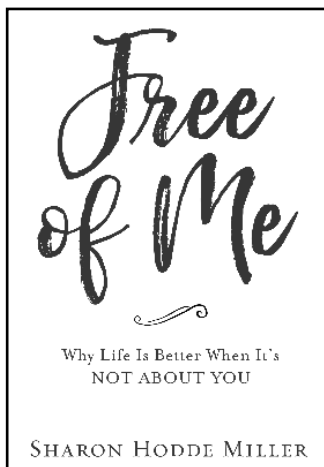

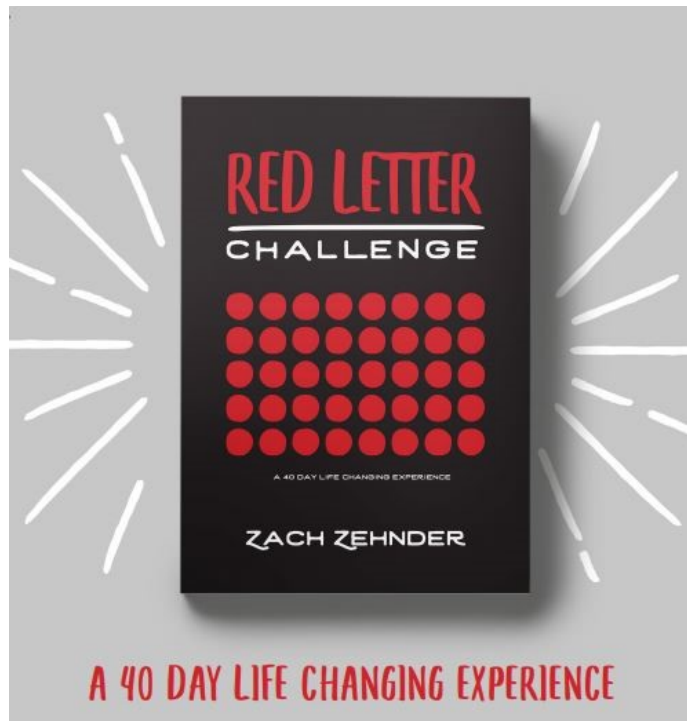

SS @ Home

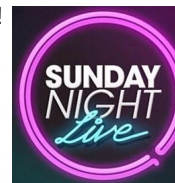

From the Larson Family in St. Louis.

Like everywhere, life at the seminary has been different after the COVID-19 outbreak. My kids and I had classes online during the spring. But as of right now, it looks like we will meet in classrooms again with masks and social distance protocols in place. I have one more year of classes left in preparation for a placement for a convertible vicarage in 2021-2022. This will be a vicarage at a congregation that is looking for a pastor which can convert into a call.

This summer I have been working part time and helping with in-home childcare. In my fieldwork congregation, my supervising pastor and I have been preparing video devotions on the Psalms this summer along with an online Vacation Bible school. If you would like to check it out, you can view them on Salem Lutheran Blackjack, Missouri's YouTube channel. I also continue to enjoy leading a musical worship team at Timothy Lutheran Church in St. Louis once a month.

Memorial safety measures for our worship gatherings to keep you informed as you make preparations to attend worship services.

At 8 AM (Worship Center) – We ask that all worshippers (unless 2 years old or younger) wear a mask into and out of the building as it is more difficult to keep our distance during those times of moving. We distribute the Lord's Supper by servers passing hosts and wine/juice by container across a table to individual communicants. We seek to eliminate touching of the actual elements by the server or any direct contact between the server and the communicant. We ask servers to disinfect their hands before serving and to wear a mask while serving. The number of songs sung has been reduced. While rows are set up 6 feet apart from one another, we encourage social distancing from people who do not live in your household as you sit in the rows. Seats & surfaces are disinfected following the 8 AM service.

At 9:30 AM (currently in the "Backyard" Sunday School area) – We ask that all worshippers (unless 2 years old or younger) wear a mask into and out of the building and also for the duration of the appx. 20-minute service (note – if

you haven't attended recently, wearing a mask for the duration of the service has been added as an additional precaution from when these services originally began in May). We ask that worshippers sign-up for this service (visit memoriallutheran.net) as attendance is limited according to space. Chair groupings are socially distanced. Distribution of the Lord's Supper takes place as worshipers take their own elements which are laid out on tables before the services. Communicants do not receive the elements from a server. All remove their masks to consume the elements when seated after receiving the elements. We are not using songs at this service. We do not produce or make available written material by paper for this service.



At 11 AM (Worship Center) – While we do not require a mask for attending these worship services, we welcome and encourage you to wear one. The Lord's Supper is distributed as in the 8 AM service. The number of songs we sing has been reduced.

FOR ALL SERVICES, communion preparation is done by individuals who wear masks. Those who fill the cups and place elements in the containers wear gloves.

Offering plates are not passed at any of the services. Offerings may be deposited in plates at the entrances.

While we greatly desire your attendance at worship, we request that you stay home if you are not feeling well.

As we move forward, we want to **welcome and encourage the wearing of facemasks at any of our services.** Please note again the restrictions for 8 AM and 9:30 AM services as written.

Our 11 AM worship service is available online (primarily on YouTube – you can access the service through our memoriallutheran.net website as well, or on Facebook).

We continue to monitor our safety protocol. We will especially be reviewing the needs of our worshipping community as we approach the fall and consider the potential need for more worship gathering opportunities. Thank you so much for your support and cooperation as we seek to gather around our Lord's Word and share the blessing of His presence in His Supper. We trust God's continual blessing!
