### MOVING FORWARD

It's springtime here in South Dakota... Well, I think it's springtime? I'm not really sure because it doesn't feel like spring. Now, some of the traditional things that mark the spring season are upon us, like the school year is over, Memorial day has happened, and the grass needs to be cut, so I'm pretty sure it's spring. But it doesn't really feel like spring yet. The school year ended without much fanfare; there was no end of year parties, no big graduation ceremonies, and the kids have been home since March. Memorial day came and went and the public pools are still closed. The only thing that tells me it's spring is...well, the grass needs to be cut. You see, there are certain things that mark the change of season for each of us. And most of those things (those traditions) have been put on hold this year, leavina us feelina like somethina is missing.

I would say that most of us have been missing certain parts of our lives. Maybe even mourning the loss of some of the freedoms we take for granted. We have been coping with this sickness that has changed the way we live. We face social distancing, job loss, school closures, business closures, and not being able to physically gather with our church community. And I have heard over and over again, "I can't wait until things get back to normal." I have also said this same thing. But, what does "back to normal" look like?

We're living in such a strange dichotomy. All of these "new" changes were thrust upon us very quickly and we have had little time to mourn the loss of the way things were. And in the beginning of COVID, I was drawn to a passage in Exodus, "And Moses said to the people, "Fear not, stand firm, and see the salvation of the Lord, which he will work for you today. For the Egyptians whom you see today, uou shall never see again. The Lord will fight for you, and you have only to be silent." (Exodus 14:13-14 ESV) Here we find the Israelites also mourning the way things were. Questioning the choices they had made as they fled Egypt. Here we find them complaining to Moses, claiming it would be better to suffer oppression from their Egyptian masters than to die out in the desert. And, in response, Moses told the people to stand firm and watch God act on their behalf.

This is such a powerful reminder that no matter how things appear, God is in control. It is also a reminder that God is a God of change. Not that He changes, but that He calls us to follow Him through change. Look at God's response in verse 15: "The Lord said to Moses, "Why do you cry to me? Tell the people of Israel to go forward." God had a plan, but for the plan to work, the people of Israel needed to keep walking...to keep going forward. As it turns out, God's plan to part the Red Sea and allow the Israelites to pass safely was a pretty good one, but it required the people to keep going. It required their faith in something bigger than what they could physically see in-front of them.

We see a similar demonstration in Joshua 3. Joshua is set to lead the people of Israel into the Promised Land, but first they have to cross the Jordan River, which just so happened to be at flood stage. God commanded the priests to carry the Ark of the Covenant ahead into the Jordan River. The Bible tells us that as soon as the feet of the priests were in the water, the flow of the river stopped, once

again allowing the people to pass on dry ground. This is a great illustration of how our faith also requires action. For the Jordan River to stop flowing, the priests first had to step into the river itself. God will be faithful to act, but we must be faithful in our obedience by continuing to move forward, to press on, and sometimes to get our feet wet. We cannot let the uncertainty of our circumstances or our fear of the unknown paralyze us. Or worse yet, have us long for the way

things were.

Your future may seem uncertain and unclear today. And that is okay! But, remember our God is working in all the uncertainty. Isaiah 43:19 says, "Behold, I am doing a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert." Sometimes, in order to perceive something new, we need to recognize what was lost. God wants to do something new in us. It's okay to pause, recognize, mourn, and lament all that is lost before we move forward into the new.

That phrase, "I am doing a new thing," was the word spoken

by God to his people. God was calling his people out from the old and into the new. God is speaking new life into each of us. He is speaking hope into our heartbreak. He is speaking peace into our chaos. He is speaking life into loss. He is speaking into our time of being still and silent. Where do you need to recognize what has been lost? Where are you seeing something new being brought forward?

In this season there are new beginnings. New rhythms. New spiritual growth. New communities formed online. New friendships. New partnerships. New hobbies. New disciplines....New life. Things will not be as they were, and I think that is the plan. God is faithful and he wants you to keep walking forward. He has a plan for your circumstance and will see you through it...not back to the way things were. And as each of us continue to take those necessary steps of faith, God will continue to show up to reveal himself to us daily, to meet our needs as he promised and use us as His voice of hope to our world.




