Songs From The Heart By Pastor Aaron Asmus

We often think of our heart as being the seat of our emotions. When we talk about sharing our most sincere feelings, we'll often use the phrase "from the bottom of my heart," that is, the very deepest part of what we feel.

While much of the Bible gives us historical narratives to tell of God's works, or prophetic pronouncement to communicate God's will, other portions of Scripture direct some of our feelings to our Lord and express

those feelings in a poetic "I wait for the way. Perhaps the book LORD, my soul of the Bible most known for this expressive poetry waits, and in His is the Book of Psalms word I hope" a collection of songs - Psalm 130:5 written by people like David who counted on an intimate relationship with the Lord God as a safe place to express the everyday concerns of the heart.

Beginning on May 30 and going through most of the month of August our Sunday morning services will be based on about a dozen of these "Songs of the Heart." There are 150 Psalms in all, so there are still many for you to explore on your own. However, in the songs you'll hear "sung," expect to identify with emotions associated with:

Longing Desire
Frustrating Choices
Being Set Free From Grief
Long-Suffering Love
Extravagant Provision
Deep Guilt
Being in Tune With God's Ways
Foolish Missteps
... And more!

These songs tell about matters of real life. And these songs are directed as prayers to our real God who holds all matters of life in His all -powerful, yet compassionate hands! I'm looking forward to singing these "Songs From The Heart!" along with you.

With great joy, we share that Association voters approved the Phase 1, Option A, high school addition with 96% support (258 yes votes, 9 no votes, and 3 abstentions). The approval includes the construction contract, associated fees and furnishings, & the LCEF bridge loan up to \$250,000. This gospel project will provide 4 classrooms, a staff room, and a learning center for high school students, with capacity to increase enrollment.






